Message from Rabbi Jordan Cohen

I am writing on Rosh Chodesh Marcheshvan, the first day of the month of Cheshvan. The name of the month originally comes from the Akkadian, *warahsamnu* (literally, "eighth month"), and was later shortened in Hebrew to "Cheshvan". The "Mar," however, was not completely lost. The phrase was re-interpreted as the Hebrew word for "bitter," suggesting that Cheshvan is bitter because it is the only month in the Hebrew calendar that does not contain a holiday or a fast. More contemporary sources refer to Cheshvan as the Rabbi's favourite month since, following the High Holy Days and Festivals of Tishrei, it provides something of a break from all the ritual intensity.



I must say, personally, this Cheshvan is something of a relief for me. Following my recent illness and unexpected hospitalization just prior to Rosh HaShanah, I feel like the last few months have been a bit of a black hole. It is a rabbi's worst nightmare to become sick just before the High Holy Days and, in 35 years of leading High Holy Day services, this was the first time it happened to me. It was a humbling experience and I am deeply grateful to everyone who pitched in to cover for me during my unintended absence and for all of the patience, support and understanding that I continue to receive. I am especially indebted to my co-clergy and life-partner, Cantor Baruch, who, during her own busiest time of the year, stepped up and did the work of two to serve the needs of our community, while also caring for a sick spouse. I am not sure how she managed, but she did, and for that we are all thankful.

I am also deeply aware that, during these past few months of ill health, I have been negligent in fully providing for the community I serve. To those for whom I was not able to be present, or failed to connect as I should, I ask your forgiveness. There is a certain measure of self-loathing in the weakened character of the Wounded-Healer, and I certainly understand that affect. As Thomas Jefferson is purported to have asked, "Who then can so softly bind up the wound of another as he who has felt the same wound himself?" We learn and we move forward from a place of understanding.

While Cheshvan may be quiet in terms of holidays, we return to our regular active schedule of programs, services and events. With our new Board members and Working Group Chairs eager and active, we are also using this time to build up our Working Groups and Task Forces, to engage with more of our members and better serve the needs of our community. I encourage you to get involved and help make Temple Anshe Sholom the kind of congregation you want it to be.

As we embrace the space of Cheshvan, we look forward to the following month of Kislev and the joyful celebration of Chanukah that will accompany the conclusion of our secular calendar year. I always take strength from the words of the Prophet Zechariah which are proclaimed on Chanukah: *Not by might, nor by power, but by My spirit, said the God of hosts* (Zechariah 4:6). With spirit comes healing and strength. Together we are the spirit of Temple Anshe Sholom.

Let's give thanks...AGAIN!

הוֹדְיָה Hoda'ah is the Hebrew word for Thanksgiving. In the Amidah, our central section of prayers we always include a prayer of Thanksgiving, which begins with the words מודה אני Modeh Ani, "I give thanks". Giving thanks for what we have, cultivates our sense of gratitude and enriches our lives by making us more aware of the blessings around us.



But didn't we just come through the national holiday of Thanksgiving? Why am I talking about Thanksgiving in the month of November! Even our own Festival of the harvest *Sukkot* is in the past. I am writing to highlight another Thanksgiving. The one south of our border in the United States. Thursday, November 28th, Americans will celebrate their national holiday. Did you know that right here in Hamilton there is a faith group that celebrates with them? This year, we are joining them in song and you are invited to be together with us. Let me explain...

Stewart Memorial Church, located on John St North downtown, is Hamilton's first black church. On August 1, 1834, Upper Canada (now Ontario), enacted the abolishment of slavery and was the first colony of the British Empire to do so. Emancipation in the United States did not occur until 30 years later. During this gap blacks escaping slavery made their way north to be our neighbours. To this day, they sing some of the same spirituals that sustained their faith through perilous times. Celebrating Thanksgiving on the third Thursday in November is also a part of their tradition.

This year our Temple Anshe Sholom Choir will join with the Stewart Memorial Church Choir in a Thanksgiving celebration of music. Join us for a wonderful Turkey dinner with all the trimmings for \$35 and stay on for our concert of beautiful and soulful music to fill you with gratitude!



Message from our Presidents - Mark Levine and Yves Apel

"Journey, Community, and Change". These are the themes in my D'rash.

My Journey:

Hinda and I have been members of TAS for 38 years. Our children have become Bar and Bat mitzvah here, and Oren has out-blasted 4 rabbis on the shofar. Hinda was involved in Temple life as a Board member and a teacher in the afternoon school. Meanwhile I focused on another part of our community, building the cancer care system in Hamilton. However, I was not completely out in the cold. I chaired the ritual Committee under Rabbi Z. Fast forward to Rosh Hashanah 2018 (5779). I remember being

at Temple with family; children, & grandchildren. I was in a great space; transitioning to retirement but still active in research, my passion. How quickly life can change.

Within one month, my father passed away in Montreal. My attention shifted to my mother's welfare. Six months later, my mother died. For the last 12 months I have been saying Kaddish every morning at the Adas Israel Synagogue because there is a minyan there. Even though I come from "the Temple", I have been welcomed and comforted by the "guys". I now do the same for new people who have recently experienced the loss of a loved one. This is an example of one of my themes for today, "**community**". We are fortunate to be part of a wider **Jewish community** in Hamilton. Finally, the experience of saying Kaddish daily has flipped on a switch within me about what it means to be Jewish.

I recall that approximately ten months ago I was invited out for coffee by a former temple president (he owns a dairy farm). We discussed the situation at the Temple. This stimulated me to take more of an interest in what was going on. The Task Force on Governance had started their work. I went to meetings, read documents, had discussions at the dinner table and sent lots of emails to Anna Rae. This growing interest evolved into a sense of responsibility "to step up". I had leadership experience in the hospital and university sectors; "maybe I could help" I thought. I agreed to sit on the Transition Committee. My five months as a member of the Transition Committee was hard work. It opened my eyes to many of the challenges faced by the Temple and to the many unsung heroes who contribute their time to keeping the Temple going. I had no idea about the amount of work which was being done daily. There are too many to name them all at the present. However, there are a few who I would like to recognize. Kevin Sampson, the Chair of the House Committee; Martin Sniderman, the Chair of the Cemetery Committee. Martin is stepping down after 10 years; and Virginia Mendes de Costa, the past President for 5 years. We owe them a debt of gratitude.

The Temple's Journey

Our congregation is 170 years old this year. During this period there have been many changes and challenges. We are living through a time of great change right now; e.g. Climate change, Brexit, Trump, and rising racism are just a few examples. The TAS microcosm is also undergoing change. Many older members who were long time supporters of TAS have passed. The demographics of the Hamilton Jewish Community have changed. Millennials are less interested in affiliation. Recognizing, the need to respond to the current challenges facing TAS, our leaders launched the Task Force on Governance. The Task Force was a catalyst (sometimes a lightening rod) for individual reflection and broad discussion. They accomplished a great deal in a relatively short time. Their recommendations were frank and bold. *Yasher koach* to Anna-Rae and her team.

The next step was to move forward with the implementation of the Task Force's Recommendations. The Transition Committee was created. The goal of the Transition Committee was to propose a slate of new board members and Working Group Chairs to be presented to the Congregation at the AGM. It was not easy. There were many evenings that we were close to "throwing in the towel" but we persevered. I want to recognize Lorraine Cohen, Simon Granat, and the Rabbi. We were a community (albeit, a small one) that worked tirelessly because failure was not an option.



In contrast to previous slates of Board members, we were starting from scratch without a Board succession cycle to draw on. There was no VP to step up to President. Key to our task was to identify a President to lead TAS. We are very fortunate that Yves Apel stepped up (although it did involve some arm twisting and finding a copresident). Those of you who attended the recent Negev Dinner hear about his many talents and accomplishments. He is energetic, upbeat, charming, and respected in our community. Once Yves agreed, it was easier to attract a slate for Board members and working Group Chairs. Yves and thank these members for stepping up. The slate was overwhelmingly approved at the AGM and we thankyou for the mandate.

<u>Change</u>

Change is never easy. It is human nature to be uncomfortable with change and to resist it. However, change is important for the sustainability of TAS. Will the governance model help address all the issues the Temple faces? To be honest, I don't think so, but it's a start. Our Board is certainly going to work hard to this end. The new board brings together a talented and experienced group of individuals with many skills. Fifty percent women and two members are young congregants. Here is the questions for you; Has any Hamilton synagogue ever had two Negev Dinner Honouress on its Board at the same time as Co-Presidents? I think this is a first. Some of our immediate priorities are as follows:

- Oversee the implementation of the Temple's new organizational structure so that it is effective and efficient
- Enhance the activities of the Caring Committee to ensure that the needs of congregants be they bereavement, social, or emotional are met
- Invigorate lay leadership participation in services, working groups, task forces, and fundraising
- Attract new members
- Develop a performance review process for staff including clergy
- Achieve financial stability

There are many strengths in the Temple community that we can harness to achieve our goals:

- Members care about TAS. I witnessed the tenacious passion congregants have for their Temple at meetings to discuss the Task Force; at 2 special Congregational meetins to change the by-laws; and at the AGM
- A strong school
- Committed and talented clergy
- Dedicated staff
- Wonderful music programs

Furthermore, in the Jewish Community at large, there are new directors at Federation and Jewish Social Services. They are initiating many new exciting programs that complement what we want to achieve.

The Days of Awe are a time when our minds turn to self examination and improvement. I ask you to look in to yourselves and take into your hearts the words of JF Kennedy; "Ask not what your country can do for you, but what you can do for your country". Please step up and get involved. Join a committee. Attend services. Support our special fundraising event which is next March. (It is called "Past, Presidents, Future" you will hear more about this from Yves). We cannot achieve our goals without your help. The time is now.

The viability and sustainability of TAS depends on you. TAS is on a journey, I am not sure where it will lead, but stay-on board.

HaShem, Rabbi, and Congregation: The task at hand is daunting. I stand before you with trepidation and nervous excitement. The Order of Canada's motto in Latin is: DESIDERANTES MELIOUREM PATRIAM (English: They desire a better country). In the next part of my life journey, I commit to making TAS a better place.

Gmar Chatima Tova. May you have a good year and a sweet year.
