Message from Rabbi Jordan Cohen

Bikkur Cholim literally translates from the Hebrew to mean, "Visiting the Sick." According to the Mishnah, Bikkur Cholim is one of the most essential of all mitzvot, whose benefits extend from this world to the world to come. A popular midrash identifies the first example of Bikkur Cholim as God visiting Abraham while he was convalescing in his tent following his circumcision (Genesis 18:1). Throughout our history, the importance of Bikkur Cholim has led to the development of Jewish social welfare organizations, hospitals and health funds, all to benefit of the sick. However, it is important to understand that Bikkur Cholim is not to be left up to professionals. The purpose of Bikkur Cholim to alleviate suffering and is incumbent upon us all. The rabbis taught that a visitor relieves an ill person of one sixtieth of their suffering (Leviticus Rabba 34). And this mitzvah to visit the sick extends to all people, not only those who are Jewish (Shulhan Arukh, Yoreh De'ah 335:1). Everyone can benefit from our presence and our prayers.



In order to strengthen our practice of this value of Bikkur Cholim throughout the community of Temple Anshe Sholom, our newly formed Kehila & Bikkur Cholim Working Group has been working diligently to develop an effective system to allow our clergy and members to know when one is ill at home, in hospital or in a long-term care facility, to arrange phone calls, visits and other forms of support, and to train a dedicated 'Bikkor Cholim Team' to be in contact with all the ill and their care-givers within our community. The dedicated members of this working group have solicited the guidance of the Victorian Order of Nurses, Hamilton Jewish Family Services and other community partners to develop a suitable strategy to best meet the needs of our community and to assure support while maintaining appropriate confidentiality and care.

Our community's Bikkur Cholim response, however, requires your participation. Far too often we hear that a member of our community is unhappy because they were ill but no one from the Temple reached out to them. Usually, that is because we did not know. We need you to tell us! If you hear of someone who is in hospital, or sick at home, please contact the Temple tell us who and where. Please do not assume we know. Better we receive multiple calls concerning an ill member of our community than none at all. You can email caring@anshesholom.ca, telephone the Temple office, or me directly, and we will mobilize our team immediately. You can help us make a difference.

If you are interested in becoming part of the Kehila & Bikkur Cholim Working Group, or making visits as part of our Bikkur Cholim team, please let us know as well. This is important work, and your involvement will be a blessing for many. It need not take a lot of time. Our Kehila & Bikkur Cholim Working Group is presenting a Bikkur Cholim Training Session on Sunday, March 15th at 1:00 PM. Everyone is welcome to join us to learn about best practices in visiting the sick and the teachings of our tradition of the importance of this sacred act. Everyone is welcome to participate.

Our God in Heaven, Shine forth Your blessing to our community of caregivers. Give us courage and renewed energy to do our holy work of caring in good faith. May we be agents of compassion, representatives of hope, messengers of laughter and light. May our own lives be blessed with wellness and security So that we may continue to bring to others the gift of ourselves. And let us say: *Amen*.

Chai Notes by Cantor Paula Baruch

Be happy...it's Adar! The happiest month of the Jewish year contains the holiday of Purim. Filled with laughter and mixed up identities, this is the celebration that brings all of us together to laugh, sing and dance together. It's proof that the Jewish people will never succumb to depression and sadness when troubles surround us. Our greatest strength is our ability to smile and laugh at ourselves and our tormentors.



The story of Esther is contained in the ancient megillah (scroll) that we will chant from this Purim. This story is notable for NOT

containing any reference to God. The Jewish people have assimilated into the Babylonian culture and when the King goes searching for a new Queen, Esther, the young Jewish heroine, is chosen. This sets up the opportunity for Esther to save her people when a tyrant, hungry for power, decides to rid the country of the Jewish people. Coache by her uncle, Mordechai, Esther musters her inner strength to approach the King and reveal her Jewish identity and the evil plot that faces her people. Ultimately, the Jewish people prevail and our story lives on to this day, allowing us to celebrate this victory over hatred.

This Hebrew year is 5780, and so, we return to our recent '80's' and find our inspiration in the popular music and culture of the 1980's. At our Purim Shpiel you can expect to hear famous hits of the 1980's such as Don't Stop Believin, Take on Me, Beat It, Don't You Forget About Me and so many more! If you are thinking about what costumes to come out in, consider the 'Where's Waldo' fad, 'Rubic's Cube', 'Parachute Pants', 'Hacky Sac', 'Shoulder Pads', 'Leg Warmers', 'Mullets', "Boom Boxes' and 'Neon Colours'. Your Board of Trustees, members and leaders of Working Groups and Task Forces continue to meet and push our agenda forward: a healthy organization that's free to focus on its mission.

Yves Apel Managing Temple's business is different from running a for-profit enterprise, or not for profit entity e.g. hospital or university, or even your own household. The decisions must be made collaboratively and everyone's a volunteer! This means that time commitments and interests vary widely, and projects don't go in a straight line, they zig-zag to the destination.

Your board is simultaneously working on several activities:

- There is a very important and exciting Temple Gala just around the corner on March 28. Please support it! A very dedicated group of individuals meet daily to create a successful fundraiser, and we are counting on our congregants to get involved, sell tickets, buy tickets, tables and sponsorships. Please visit be sure to visit PastPresidentsFuture.ca.
- We are instituting better cost controls, while looking for ways to maintain high quality programming
- We are reviewing our commitments and contracts with vendors for efficiencies
- Last month the following Working Groups met: Clergy Liaison, Budget & Finance, House, Human Re-Fundraising, Cemetery; and Kehila & Bikkur Cholim. sources,
- We are investing in physical and cyber security for our premises.
- The new Membership Task force has been meeting to jump start our membership drive. Its mandate is to investigate best ways to recruit and retain members, and to recommend an optimal dues structure.
- We are continuing the work started by the previous board to determine the feasibility of selling part of the Limeridge Road cemetery lands
- We are studying how low interest rates earned on a portion of the Temple endowment fund can lower our carrying costs; whether it's possible for the Temple to make interest payments directly to our own endowment fund instead of paying them to the bank, in essence lowering Temple carrying costs paid on our operating line without sacrificing the rate our endowment fund earns.

As we engage in the day-to-day management and the initiatives designed to improve our financial health, we want to encourage your participation and good will. In the intermediate future, please support our first major fundraiser in five years on March 28th, mark Rabbi Baskin's 100th Birthday, celebrate our past presidents and the Temple's 170th anniversary!
